## ***Dr. Dan Turner, Guest Conductor***

Dan Turner graduated from Bob Jones University in 1972 and earned both the master's and Doctor of Education degrees from the University of Illinois. From 1972 through 1984 he directed the three pre-college bands at Bob Jones schools and since 1983 has been conductor of the University Symphonic Band. In addition to conducting the Wind Band, Dr. Turner serves as the head of the Department of Music Education and teaches tuba, undergraduate and graduate-level music education courses, and education history. He plays tuba in the Foundation Brass, the professional brass sextet in residence at Bob Jones University, in the Bob Jones University Symphony Orchestra, and in the Anderson (SC) Chamber Orchestra. He is also active in presenting workshops on Christian school band programs and has conducted numerous band clinics and all-state festivals throughout the south and mid-west.

Dr. Turner is the author of *Standing Without Apology: The History of Bob Jones University* and *Reflecting God's Light*, the seventy-fifth anniversary book of BJU.

He is married to award-winning novelist Jamie Langston Turner. They have one son, Jess, who is completing graduate school at BJU in trumpet performance and composition.

**HISTORY.** On September 17, 1974, a group of pastors and Christian school administrators gathered out of mutual concern for the need for Christian schools in doctrinal agreement to unite their efforts in order to strengthen their cause for Christian education. Today, full-time staff members work with numerous volunteers to coordinate KCEA's activities, to help schools run quality programs, and to be a voice for its constituents at Harrisburg's legislature.

**MINISTERING TO STUDENTS.** KCEA encourages students to grow spiritually and to develop their talents through opportunities such as All-State Choir; Bible Quizzing; competitions or festivals in the areas of Bible, academics, and fine arts; and athletic competitions in soccer, volleyball, and basketball. A High School Civics Day provides an opportunity to observe firsthand how government really works. The Keystone Christian Honor Society challenges students to develop a servant's heart while striving for academic excellence.

**ASSISTING FAMILIES.** KCEA is a listed Scholarship Organization in Pennsylvania's Education Improvement Tax Credit program. The Scholarship Fund assists modest-income families with tuition at the KCEA-affiliated school of their choice. \$1,141,874 was awarded to 1,714 students throughout the state between January 2002 and June 2006. Donations come from businesses that pay specific state business taxes. Business donors can obtain up to a 90% tax credit by contributing to this program. Information is available through the KCEA office.

**HELPING CHURCH AND SCHOOL LEADERS.** As needs arise, the administration and/or staff in our Christian schools contact the KCEA office for guidance and counsel. They know KCEA keeps abreast of current trends and issues and can provide accurate, up-to-date information. Each fall KCEA hosts a Christian Education Conference to help enrich the teaching and administrative staffs both academically and spiritually. KCEA also helps with teacher/staff placement, administers staff certification and school accreditation, offers achievement tests at discount rates, and provides regular updates and information to the schools. Keystone staff members are available for speaking engagements.

**WATCHING LEGISLATION.** KCEA stands as a watchman at Harrisburg to help protect the rights of the family to choose the education for their children, to protect the interests of the institutions that serve these children, and to represent our churches in matters that would or could affect their ministry and outreach.

**AFFILIATION.** Christian schools in agreement with the KCEA doctrinal statement and with a strong testimony of excellence and good Christian character may affiliate with KCEA. "Sustaining Affiliation" is available to churches without schools and to interested individuals. Financial gifts are tax-deductible.
