Meet Your Assembly Speakers

Dr. Brian Carruthers

Dr. Carruthers is Dean of the School of Education, Bob Jones University, Greenville, South Carolina. He earned a B.S. in Biology and an M.S. in Educational Administration and Supervision from BJU, as well as an Ed.D. in Educational Leadership from Nova Southeastern University.

Dr. Carruthers has taught numerous education classes, participated in missions training opportunities in South America, co-authored with Dr. Jim Deuink the revision of Management Principles for Christian Schools, and published articles in Today's Christian Preacher. He additionally serves in various other education capacities in his church, city, and state.

Dr. Rand Hummel

Rand Hummel currently serves as the Director of THE WILDS of New England located in the peaceful, rural setting of Deering, New Hampshire. Prior to this position, Rand was the Assistant Director of THE WILDS in North Carolina where he served as Program Director for 20 years.

Rand has authored several Bible helps for adults and teens to assist them in their daily Christian walk. Rand holds a B.A. in Bible and an honorary doctorate from Bob Jones University in Greenville, South Carolina.

Dr. Mark Rasmussen
