HISTORY. On September 17, 1974, a group of pastors and Christian school administrators gathered out of mutual concern for the need for Christian schools in doctrinal agreement to unite their efforts in order to strengthen their cause for Christian education. Today, full-time staff members work with numerous volunteers to coordinate KCEA's activities, to help schools run quality programs, and to be a voice for its constituents at Harrisburg's legislature.

MINISTERING TO STUDENTS. KCEA encourages students to grow spiritually and to develop their talents through opportunities such as All-State Choir; Bible Quizzing; competitions or festivals in the areas of Bible, academics, and fine arts; and athletic competitions in soccer, volleyball, and basketball. A High School Civics Day provides an opportunity to observe firsthand how government really works. The Keystone Christian Honor Society challenges students to develop a servant's heart while striving for academic excellence.

ASSISTING FAMILIES. KCEA is a listed Scholarship Organization in Pennsylvania's Education Improvement Tax Credit program. The Scholarship Fund assists modest-income families with tuition at the KCEA-affiliated school of their choice. \$1,947,419 was awarded to 2,897 students throughout the state between January 2002 and June 2010. Donations come from businesses that pay specific state business taxes. Business donors can obtain up to a 90% tax credit by contributing to this program. Information is available through the KCEA office.

HELPING CHURCH AND SCHOOL LEADERS. As needs arise, the administration and/or staff in our Christian schools contact the KCEA office for guidance and counsel. They know KCEA keeps abreast of current trends and issues and can provide accurate, up-to-date information. Each fall KCEA hosts a Christian Education Conference to help enrich the teaching and administrative staffs both academically and spiritually. KCEA also helps with teacher/staff placement, administers staff certification and school accreditation, offers achievement tests at discount rates, and provides regular updates and information to the schools. Keystone staff members are available for speaking engagements.

WATCHING LEGISLATION. KCEA stands as a watchman at Harrisburg to help protect the rights of the family to choose the education for their children, to protect the interests of the institutions that serve these children, and to represent our churches in matters that would or could affect their ministry and outreach.

AFFILIATION. Christian schools in agreement with the KCEA doctrinal statement and with a strong testimony of excellence and good Christian character may affiliate with KCEA. "Sustaining Affiliation" is available to churches without schools and to interested individuals. Financial gifts are tax-deductible.

Dr. Bruce Cox Band Guest Conductor

Dr. Bruce Cox is in his twenty-sixth year on the faculty of Bob Jones University where he is the department head for instrumental studies, teaches trumpet, and directs the University Trumpet Choir and Concert Band. He completed his DMA in trumpet performance and pedagogy in 1995 from the University of Southern Mississippi after earning a bachelor's degree from BJU and a master's degree from the University of Illinois. His principal trumpet teachers include Argyle Paddock, Michael Tunnell, and Allan Cox, with additional lessons under Ray Sasaki, Ruth Still, Robert Nagel, and Larry Black. Bruce currently performs with the Spartanburg Philharmonic Orchestra, the Greater Anderson Musical Arts Consortium, and BJU's faculty brass ensemble, Foundation Brass. Active as a band conductor, Bruce has been guest clinician for private school band festivals in six states. He and his wife, Jennifer, have three children; their family attends Suber Road Baptist Church in Greer, SC, where he has served as minister of music since 1987.

Jay-Martin Pinner Orchestra Guest Conductor

Jay-Martin Pinner earned a bachelor of arts degree in church music and a master of arts degree in violin performance from Bob Jones University. He founded the Bob Jones Academy and Junior High Orchestras, and for 28 years coordinated the University's precollege orchestra program. He served as head of the BJU string department for 25 years. He and his wife, Dianne, co-founded the BJU Summer Music Camps in 1979.

Jay has appeared as concertmaster, soloist and conductor with the BJU Symphony Orchestra, and for five seasons played principal viola with the Greenville Symphony Orchestra. He has conducted the BJU String Orchestra in concert and on tour, and shared conducting responsibilities for the BJU High School Festival String Orchestra. He regularly conducts All-State, Honors and Regional Orchestras, and adjudicates for Orchestra Festivals.

Currently Jay is a free-lance musician and runs a private string teaching studio, www.pinnerstudios.com, with over 125 students studying violin, viola, cello, double bass and classical guitar.
